Since 2012, PA taxpayers have spent more than \$1 billion on cyber charter tuition bills. Some of PA's cyber schools are among lowest performing schools in the state and not one cyber charter school has achieved a passing score of 70 on the SPP. Additionally, most PA cyber schools did not once achieve Adequate Yearly Progress from 2005-2012, when this was the measure for school success. While cyber education is appropriate for some students, PA's cyber schools have not improved PA's education system in spite of receiving more than \$1 billion in taxpayer funds.
